The Angler's Boutique Resort • South Beach • Modern (49 rms)

The Angler's, an Art Deco gem that has been renovated and converted into a stylish boutique hotel, is an elegant and sophisticated getaway on frenetic Washington Avenue that's getting rave reviews for outstanding service. It's a couple of blocks from the beach, but private outdoor spa baths and a pool with an adjoining lounge should address any aquatic relaxation needs, and a sidewalk cafe is just the place for sipping a café au lait and people-watching. The fully furnished suites have a serene Zen vibe and are well equipped with the latest gizmos—plasma TVs, iPod docking stations, DVD players—and spa services are available in-room and poolside. Nightlife impresario Michael Capponi is a partner in this venture, so guests can expect VIP access to hot South Beach nightlife, and may even spot celeb guests at this hideaway. The Betsy • South Beach • Timeless (63 rms)

You may recall the Betsy Ross in South Beach—the sole Georgian-style building in Florida, with columns and pediments amid a sea of pastel Art Deco fluff. The old gal has dropped her surname and neatly converted her colonial roots into a tropical plantation design that now includes shuttered windows, rich wooden floors, and poster beds. Rooms (in shades of lavender, ochre, coral, or spring green) are bright and warm and come with Frette linens, roomy walk-in showers (complete with rainfall showerheads), robes, slippers, and Malin+Goetz amenities. A rooftop lounge, garden wellness spa, and small pool cater to a quiet, genteel crowd, while artwork, photography, and books throughout the hotel aim to create a cultural oasis in a part of town known more for silicone than sophistication. The chic bistro BLT Steak is here, along with a smart lobby bar serving classic cocktails with sweet and spicy popcorn. Gansevoort South Hotel • South Beach • Modern (334 rms)

Manhattan moves to Miami Beach with the debut of the long-anticipated Gansevoort South on a whole city block in the up-and-coming luxurious north end of South Beach. There's a huge David Barton Gym and Spa, a scenery rooftop pool, and a grownup playground; boutiques INCA, Big Drop, and Cutler; and hip restaurant STK. But it's unmistakably Miami too, with a 50-foot shark tank in the lobby, teepees and fire-pits on the palmy beach, a spectacular infinity pool overlooking the Atlantic, a hot lounge from the Opium Group, and the very first Cafe Bustelo lounge for all your cafecito needs. Interior designer Andi Pepper and architect Stephen B. Jacobs have given the ultramodern lobby whimsical touches, like rainbow-colored lighting and massive armchairs, while oversize rooms feature gray suede walls with hot pink accents, and, in most cases, large balconies overlooking the ocean or bay. Mondrian South Beach • South Beach • Trendy (335 rms)

Jet-setters, welcome: From the folks who brought you Delano and The Shore Club comes Mondrian, an arty extravaganza on the quieter residential end of South Beach, but minutes from the action. Designed by Marcel Wanders, this hotel's whimsical elements—chandeliers encased in an oversize gold bell, a waterfront bar beneath an enormous ruffled lampshade, black-and-white motifs—set the stage for fun and fantasy. Bright, open rooms overlook the bay and the ocean and feature upscale niceties like down comforters, TiVo DVR, and Bose iPod speakers. Best bet: Sunset Lounge and pool area, where greenery-covered cabanas, secret pathways, and “kissing corners” are sure to attract paparazzi. \$\$\$\$ 1100 West Ave. (11th St.), 305-514-1500 / 800-697-1791, mondrian-miami.com

Viceroy Hotel • Brickell • Trendy (162 rms)

There's a new contender for most fabulous hotel pool: the 300-foot infinity pool overlooking the Miami River and Biscayne Bay at the fabulous new Viceroy Miami in the downtown Brickell business district. On the 15th-floor two-acre pool terrace is a bar and fireplace, a life-size chess set, and the poolside restaurant and lounge. Inside the Asian-themed rooms are Kelly Wearstler-designed robes and Sferra linens, organic minibars, and well-appointed kitchens. Among the hotel's interesting amenities: errand runners for the Brickell area, motor scooters and bicycles for guest use, Wii and PlayStation consoles, and VIP access to Club 50, the private pool lounge 50 stories high. Expect great things from this dazzler as its massive spa and signature restaurant open; the Viceroy's launch attracted celebs Selma Blair, Sharon Stone, and Gloria and Emilio Estefan, to name a few. \$\$\$ 485 Brickell Ave. (SE Fifth St.), 305-503-4400 / 866-781-9923, viceroymiami.com


W South Beach • South Beach • Trendy (312 rms)

This long-awaited addition to the less-hectic but exceedingly happening north end of South Beach is simply dazzling. The clever design gives all the super-spacious rooms ocean views, and the lavish features include signature comfy beds, private balconies, two flat-screen TVs, and bathrooms with spa showers. Reserve the Mega Suite, a gloriously roomy studio loft with a private glass balcony offering gorgeous unobstructed views of the ocean and beach. The heated pool targets the party crowd, with private cabanas and cool cocktails, while the Grove oceanfront bar amid lush gardens is ideal for relaxing with a papaya daiquiri. Bliss amenities are part of the package (and the Bliss spa opens in December). But make no mistake about it, the W is all about a vibrant see-and-be-seen scene: the Living Room lobby lounge, an eclectic hangout with live DJ mixes; trendy A-lister-packed Mr. Chow; and Soleá, serving up Mediterranean cuisine. One caveat: From the W, as well as from the nearby Setai and Gansevoort, it's a bit of a hike to busy Lincoln Road and Ocean Drive, which can be good or bad, depending on your perspective. \$\$\$\$ 2201 Collins Ave. (22nd St.), 305-938-3000, starwoodhotels.com

Asia de Cuba • South Beach • Latin/Asian

The shiny white restaurant inside the fairy-tale castle that is the Mondrian, this South Beach outpost from the China Grill team is buzzing with a cosmopolitan

see-and-be-seen crowd: A-Rod, Ivana Trump, and Marilyn Manson were among early celeb guests. On the menu are trendy—and pricey—Asianized Cuban dishes, like ropa vieja of duck, Cuban BBQ chicken with Thai coconut sticky rice, and sides of panko-crusting crispy plantain. BLT Steak • South Beach • French Bistro

Miami didn't need another steak house, but it certainly couldn't turn away chef Laurent Tourondel, whose BLT Steak combines French savvy with South Beach flair. American Wagyu, USDA prime, and certified Angus beef are on the menu, as are sea salt-crusting red snapper and spicy grilled swordfish. Sides like jalapeño mashed potatoes and hen-of-the-woods mushrooms are a nice touch, and artisanal cheeses on the dessert menu add culinary depth not always found in this neck of South Beach. Located in the chic, revamped Betsy, BLT Steak is cozy and convivial. Blu la Pizzeria de Sole • Brickell • Italian


Part of the bustling Mary Brickell Village, Blu offers much more than a buzzy bar scene—the food is simply terrific. Choose your favorite pizza or panino, baked in a wood-burning oven, or try the house-made pasta dishes, antipasti, fish, or veal. While everything tastes authentically Italian (the executive chef was born near Rome), there are some unusual healthy options: All pizzas are available with crust made from organic soy flour, and no trans fats are used. Still, it's easy to overindulge in this convivial stone and wood space. Bourbon Steak • Outskirts • Steak House

Acclaimed chef Michael Mina brings his talents to Aventura's Fairmont Tumbery Isle Resort & Club in the form of a modern American steak house. As at Mina's Las Vegas outpost, Stripsteak at Mandalay, center stage is a wood-burning grill for prime meats like American Kobe and Japanese A5 (the highest designation) Kobe, which are first poached in butter. Duck-fat French fries, butter-poached lobster, and roasted whole foie gras appetizers fill out your fat quota for the next decade or so. A stunning glass-box entry welcomes guests, who can dine in the mirrored dining room or the casual tavern and bar area. Cita's Italian Chophouse • Coconut Grove • Italian


It's just what the Grove needed: an upscale fine-dining restaurant that's elegant but informal enough to take advantage of the area's laid-back charm. Cita's fills the bill nicely, serving good pasta, prime steaks, and market-fresh seafood and drawing a friendly, appreciative crowd. The expansive menu lists antipasti and

carpacci; risotti and pastas, including homemade fettuccine and ravioli; and prime steak from all-natural hormone- and antibiotic-free livestock. The house specialty: a 32-ounce Tomahawk rib eye. 8 Oz. Burger Bar • South Beach • Burger Joint

The burger craze is gaining traction, with Fatburger on Washington, Oneburger in Coral Gables, and 8 Oz. Burger Bar in the old Novecento space on Alton Road. Executive chef Govind Armstrong's California style means you'll find mostly local organic produce; burgers made with hormone-free Black Angus sirloin, short rib, and chuck; and house-cured bacon and homemade pickles. Extras like roasted garlic aioli, roasted baby broccoli, and chocolate peppermint shakes make it clear you're not in greasy spoon territory. Of course, there's an interesting beer, wine, and cocktail list, including bacon-infused bloody Marys and that California staple, basil elderflower daiquiris. *Sun–Wed 11am–midnight, Thu–Sat 11am–2am.* \$ = 1080 Alton Rd. Eos at Viceroy • Brickell • Mediterranean


Overlooking Biscayne Bay and downtown Miami, the 15th floor of the dramatic Viceroy Miami is the setting for Eos, the Mediterranean-inspired restaurant from chef Michael Psilakis that's attracting foodies in search of the unexpected. The twist? Sushi and sashimi with unexpected ingredients, and Greek spins on traditional dishes—raw tuna served with watermelon and feta, or oyster ceviche accompanied by tomatillo, Peruvian chili, and plum. Smoked octopus comes with pineapple, spicy sopressata, and skordalia, and a Greek paella includes orzo and merguez, a spicy North African sausage. You can do small plates nicely here, but the restaurant will roast a baby goat, pig, or lamb for a celebration (call in advance). *Mon–Wed 7am–2pm and 6–10pm, Thu–Sat 7am–2pm and 6–11pm, Sun 7am–2pm.* \$\$  = Viceroy Miami, 485 Brickell Ave. (SE Fifth St.), 305-503-0373, viceroymiami.com

Hakkasan • Mid-Beach • Chinese

Alan Yau, of the UK's only Michelin-rated Chinese restaurant, brings haute Chinese stateside at this seductively dim rooftop space of ebony wood, carved teak, and silk lanterns. While exceedingly expensive (the Peking duck appetizer with golden Osetra caviar goes for a cool \$195), Hakkasan turns out impeccable dishes like spicy Assam prawns and crispy Szechuan shredded rib-eye beef. There's a large menu of New World wines and sake, as well as signature cocktails made from vodka, coconut, lychee juice, and passion fruit. Like all the venues at the dazzling, high-wattage Fontainebleau, Hakkasan attracts celebs and dressed-to-impress locals. *Tue–Sun 6pm–close.* \$\$\$\$  = Fontainebleau Miami Beach, 4441 Collins Ave. (44th St.), 786-276-1388, fontainebleau.com

La Marea • South Beach • Mediterranean


The pale, elegant restaurant at the austere Tides has relaunched under the guidance of executive chef Pietro Rota, an Italian native who has brought fresh seafood, flown in daily, and sprightly Mediterranean flavors to this stylish venue. Imported loup de mer, fresh sardines, and whole dorade are filleted table-side and served with rare salts and olive oil, while pasta dishes include such specialties as

bigoli (whole wheat pasta) and paccheri (artisan rigatoni with pork cheeks and porcini mushrooms). Ideal for a romantic evening, it's pricey, special-occasion dining that will be even more memorable if you get a table on the terrace, where lush shrubs provide privacy from noisy Ocean Drive. *Daily 7am–11pm.* \$\$\$  = The Tides, 1220 Ocean Dr. (12th St.), 305-604-5070, tidessouthbeach.com


Mai Tardi • Design District • Italian

Mai Tardi—"never late" in Italian—has joined what is arguably South Florida's hottest dining 'hood: the Design District. Moving into the old Brosia spot, with its lovely mosaic patio and shady oak trees, Mai Tardi serves Northern Italian fare—thin-crust pizzas from the wood-burning oven, gnocchi, cured meats, tapas, and comforting pasta dishes. All this comes from the same folks who are behind successful casual Italian eateries Tiramesu, Spris, and Segafredo. Meat Market • South Beach • Steak House

Yes, another steak house, but it's well done, South Beach style. From the talents who created the celebrated fare at now-closed Touch, this Lincoln Road restaurant has a loungey raw bar and an extensive seafood menu in addition to steaks. And let's talk about those steaks: They're presented in a three-tiered format, starting with simple à la carte selections, moving to ultra-premium cuts, and culminating in house creations like buffalo tenderloin steak with a chili and espresso rub or tropical braised fatty brisket with coconut and mango. Also on the menu: house-made sauces and butters plus sides like truffle creamed corn, summer squash cobbler, and bacon and onion creamed spinach. *Mon–Thu 5pm–midnight, Fri–Sat 5pm–1am.* \$\$\$  = 915 Lincoln Rd. Mr. Chow • South Beach • Chinese

It didn't take long for the South Beach outpost of Mr. Chow (already a hot commodity in London, LA, and New York) to attract celebs like Randy Jackson, Ryan Seacrest, and Michael Jordan, along with the local eye candy. Mr. Chow joins nearby competitors Philippe in the Gansevoort and Hakkasan in the Fontainebleau as a high-end Chinese hot spot where the focus is on the scene more than the cuisine. Located in the trendy new W hotel, the dramatic space features a 123-foot gold-leaf and Swarovski crystal chandelier, a sleek bar, and a roomy outside dining patio. A nightly noodle-pulling show reveals the talents of the top Chinese chefs here, and dishes like green prawns and Beijing duck get accolades. Ola at Sanctuary • South Beach • Latin American

High-profile chef Douglas Rodriguez's creative flair elevates typical Latin specialties like ceviches and empanadas to something close to sublime, thanks to the inventive fusion of Latin American ingredients with Asian, Peruvian, and Mediterranean flavors. Indulge your sweet tooth with the dessert tasting menu, featuring such extreme sugar highs as chocolate tres leches or churros—sweet

fritters—with Venezuelan chocolate sauce. Of course, no authentic Latin meal would be complete without a premium hand-rolled Dominican cigar. There's a small bar, but folks are here for the food and the festive ambience. Plat Bleu • South Beach • French Bistro

De rigueur for the chic crowd, the Delano has revamped its east end to create a charming Brazilian-French bistro. The menu includes Brazilian skirt steak skewers; savory Carioca breads laden with mozzarella, tomatoes, and Parmigiano; and sexy sandwiches like lobster clun or duck confit medianoches. Plop yourself down at one of the marble tables or stake out one of the leather sofas, order a Cobb salad, and nurse a caipirinha all day while watching the parade of beautiful or otherwise interesting people parade through. Prelude by Barton G. • Downtown Miami • American

Impresario Barton G. Weiss—known for extravagant events that sometimes involve giraffes and chimps, as well as his eponymous special-occasion restaurant in South Beach—has opened an elegant dining spot inside the Arsht Center. While you may not find swordfish chunks skewered on sabers, you can expect inventive cuisine with appropriate dramatic flair: Gorgeous serving dishes showcase novelties such as buttery poached baby shrimp salad and caramel apple sundaes, served in time for showgoers to make the performance. Prix-fixe Diner's Decision dinners are \$39 for any three courses; lunch and brunch is \$23 for any two courses. Prime Italian • South Beach • Italian

From the same folks who brought the incredibly popular South of Fifth hot spots Prime 112 and Nemo comes this Italian eatery in South Beach, serving Kobe meatball sliders, brick oven pizzas, fried risotto balls stuffed with Kobe Bolognese, pasta, and other haute comfort foods, plus prime steaks. Expect treats like mini Philly cheesesteaks and prosciutto served with crisp apple, gorgonzola, and toasted walnuts, plus shaved Italian ice-tinis in lemon, cherry, blood orange, and pomegranate. Scarpetta • Mid-Beach • Italian

If you were down to your last few bucks, would you blow \$23 for Scarpetta's spaghetti al pomodoro? Absolutely. This humble dish, each pale al dente strand infused with tomato and basil goodness, rises to the height of pure bliss. But there are plenty of other reasons to splurge on Scott Conant's outstanding Italian cuisine, like agnolotti dal plin, fresh pasta filled with meat, mushrooms, and cheese; crispy fritto misto; and exquisite cheeses, like the paglierina, served

with stewed figs, chamomile, and honey. The elegant setting is vaguely nautical, with black-and-white mosaic art at the bar, and a breezy outdoor terrace overlooks the pool and ocean. Talavera • Coral Gables • Mexican

Coral Gables' restaurant row gets fine Mexican cuisine with upscale, flavorful cuisine at Talavera, a convivial spot worth a special trip. From the same folks who brought the very popular Jaguar to Coconut Grove, Talavera plays whimsical homage to Mexican icons such as Carlos Santana, Cantinflas, and Salma Hayek, and showcases typical blue Mexican pottery, which shows up in tableware and as a wall motif.
